## Tomales Bay Vessel Management Plan

The first step in a comprehensive plan for Tomales Bay outlined in the GFNMS Draft Management Plan. (RP-12)







Research • Education • Conservation • Stewardship

### Vessel Management Goals and Objectives



- Protect public health and improve water quality
- Protect habitat and decrease threats to and disturbance of wildlife
- Ensure safe and enjoyable waterrelated recreation



## Management Issues

- Pathogen impairment; sewage discharges
- Discharges of fuel, oil and toxics
- Invasive species
- Seagrass protection
- Preventing wildlife disturbance
- Protecting public safety



### **Process to Date**

- On August 31st 10 agencies released a document for public input: "Protecting Tomales Bay by Managing Vessel Usage"
  - Outreach to the Tomales Bay Watershed Council
  - Informational meetings with interested stakeholders
  - Held three workshops- 98 participants
  - Completed a 90 day public comment period on December 3rd
- 41 items of written comment received



### Recommendations for Action Presented in Published Document

- Remove abandoned and derelict vessels and moorings
- Replace un-permitted moorings with better moorings and create a permit system
- Create seagrass protection zones and prohibit anchoring there (education & enforcement)
- Minimize sewage and other discharges (provide facilities, implement NDZ & boater education)
- Prevent introduction of invasive species (education)
- Expand current and future permitting and enforcement procedures and programs.



## Moving Forward: Where We Are Headed

- Assess potential for surveys & seagrass monitoring
- Finalizing criteria for protection of resources
- Developing mooring permit program
- Develop criteria for acceptable mooring tackle
- Develop implementation strategy for seagrass protection zones (re: anchoring)
- Develop plan for removal of derelict moorings
- Install sewage and oil services get NDZ
   designation

## **Proposed Timeline**

### January/February

- SAC Working group starts meeting once every 6 weeks to assist interagency group in addressing core issues / uncertainties
- Publish response to comments

### **January- August**

- GFNMS implementation of non-regulatory recommendations NDZ
   Designation
- Obtain funding for sewage and oil facilities
- Develop boater education and outreach plan

#### Summer

- Begin development of EIS/EIR
- Prepare Notice of Intent to release Draft Vessel Management Plan

#### **Fall**

Release draft Vessel Management Plan
