Makes positive impacts on the environment











Examples of School Accomplishments

Pacific Grove Middle School Pacific Grove, CA

Over a 3-year period, students worked hard to educate their community about the impact of waste on the ocean. They succeeded in getting balloons officially prohibited in public parks in their city and in all schools in their district.



Will C. Wood Middle School Alameda, CA

As part of a 4 year project, students collected nearly 10,000 nurdles from local coastlines and created a permanent marine debris interpretive sign for a nearby beach entrance.



Gault School Santa Cruz, CA

In their first Ocean
Guardian year, students
have become engaged
stakeholders by
transforming coastal
ecological community. They
removed over 7,000 square
feet of invasives and
propagated and planted
nearly 5,000 native plants.
