Dear Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council Applicant:

We are in the process of filling several vacant seats on our sanctuary advisory council: Conservation (Primary and Alternate), Research (Primary and Alternate), Maritime Activities-Recreational (Primary and Alternate), Community At-Large Marin/Sonoma (Primary and Alternate), and Community At-Large San Francisco/San Mateo (Alternate). Beginning immediately, we will accept applications and nominations for council membership.

The Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council was established pursuant to Federal law to ensure continued public participation in the management of the sanctuary. Specifically, the council's role is to provide advice on: (1) protecting sanctuary wildlife and habitats, and identifying and evaluating emergent or critical issues involving sanctuary ecosystems and cultural resources; (2) identifying and realizing the sanctuary's research objectives; (3) identifying and realizing educational opportunities to increase the public knowledge and stewardship of the sanctuary environment; and (4) assisting to develop an informed constituency to increase awareness and understanding of the purpose and value of the sanctuary and NOAA's Office of National Marine Sanctuaries (ONMS).

Enclosed is our sanctuary advisory council application kit, which includes a copy of the Council Charter and an application sheet, as well as additional information about the sanctuary. Council members serve a 3-year term.

Please note that if you have been a federally registered lobbyist in the two-year period before your potential appointment date to the council, you will not be eligible to serve as a member of a sanctuary advisory council.

We are looking forward to receiving completed applications at **GFNMS, attn. Leslie Abramson, 991 Marine Dr., The Presidio, San Francisco, CA 94129; or 415-561-6616 (fax), attn. Leslie Abramson; or Leslie.Abramson@noaa.gov; by June 30, 2014.** Applications will be reviewed by a preliminary review panel consisting of members from the advisory council. The panel will help us narrow down the number of candidates to the top three. Of these advisory council members will be chosen, and officially notified of their selection.
