

- Confirming membership

- 3 conceptual designs the WG will consider:
- 1. Implement a year-round voluntary vessel speed reduction (VSR) throughout GFNMS and CBNMS.
- Alter trajectory of the northern lane, and extend the northern & western shipping lanes farther west with year-round voluntary VSR.
- 3. Extend western traffic lane to the sanctuary boundary with yearround voluntary VSR, & remove the northern traffic lane.


ONMS National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA) report


